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

Message from Founder & Executive Director

Dear Friends,

Premiere Performances hit double digits in September 2017 when we turned TEN! To mark this special occasion, we brought back lots of friends and threw not one but two big parties, at our 10th Anniversary Gala. You can read about our Anniversary festivities on pages 8-9. We also presented some amazing concerts at City Hall, including Benjamin Appl, our first-ever lieder recital, as well as the sold-out Danish String Quartet.

If someone had told me when I arrived in Hong Kong in 2004 as a corporate lawyer (pregnant with my first child), that I would go on to become a classical music concert presenter and a champion of chamber music, I would never have believed them! The idea to start Premiere Performances came to me in the spring of 2006 when I was still working as a lawyer. I attended a few concerts in Hong Kong which triggered my memory of an arts organization from my childhood that specialized in solo recitals and chamber music and which transformed the cultural landscape of Vancouver. I felt that Hong Kong was ripe for something like this and despite my complete lack of experience in either music or arts administration, I charged full steam ahead.

Fast forward ten years, and Premiere Performances now has a full time staff of 8, and we present over 100 events per year, reaching almost 30,000 people across Hong Kong of every age and demographic. During this time, I have been witness to an incredible transformation in the arts & cultural life of Hong Kong. It has been incredibly gratifying to feel we have made a meaningful impact on our city. (And I now have three children, the oldest of which is turning 15!)

We could not have done this without the help of the Hong Kong Government. At the point where the chamber music festival had grown so large that I was drowning (working with only one assistant), the Home Affairs Bureau awarded us a Springboard Grant, enabling me to hire a staff and rent an office. Through the government's continued support and the introduction of the Art Development Matching Grants Scheme, we have continued to expand our programmes, reaching more and more people every year, as well as expanding our sponsorship network and individual donor list. This public-private alliance is necessary for our long-term sustainability.

Looking ahead, the future is bright. It is exciting to think about where we will be ten years from now!?

Our Programmes

Hong Kong International Chamber Music Festival

Every January the Hong Kong International Chamber Music Festival, under the guidance of Artistic Director Cho-Liang Lin, brings the best in the world to Hong Kong for two weeks of chamber music performances, including six ticketed concerts and 20+ Outreach & Education events. This is chamber music at the highest international standards.

Recital Series

Throughout the year, Premiere Performances presents a Recital Series, presenting rising stars to seasoned international favourites. Since 2007, we have presented almost 50 artists in solo recitals, many of them making their Hong Kong debut.

Family Series

To bring the thrill of live music performances to young audiences, Premiere Performances presents afternoon concerts specifically designed for children and performed by top local and international musicians. Not just classical music, the Family Series has also featured jazz, folk, world music and Chinese instruments as well as musical storytelling and narration.

Education & Outreach

Premiere Performances aims to make classical music accessible to all. We increase participants' appreciation of music and bring the joys of music-making to diverse audiences through school performances, teacher development sessions, free concerts, masterclasses, music education talks, and ticket giveaways.



Beneficiaries

Our audience comes from across Hong Kong, is mostly local (60% native Cantonese speakers). And is mostly between the ages of 30 and 50 years). From special needs students through to the elite of Hong Kong, we have programmes aimed at all demographics of Hong Kong society. We believe that everybody, regardless of social class or education, ethnicity or language, will be moved by the power of a live music performance presented at a world class level.



Donor Programmes

In addition to our general Friends of Premiere Performances Circle, we have created three specially tailored donor programmes to support the work that we do. Developing a strong and stable donor base is particularly important because we have a matching grant where every dollar we raise from donors is matched by the Home Affairs Bureau. Without private donations, we would simply not be able to continue delivering the range and quality of our programmes.

10th Anniversary

September 2017 marked the 10th Anniversary of Premiere Performances, and we celebrated this milestone with a weekend of exciting events. Starting from a four-concert Rising Stars Piano Series in September 2007 and growing into a presenter of over 100 events reaching almost 30,000 people annually, there was a lot to celebrate!

On September 23, we hosted our first fundraising Gala Dinner at beautiful Liang Υi Museum on Hollywood Road with a cocktail reception, intimate concert with our international musicians, and an elegant seated dinner. 






Free Gala Concert

On 24 September 2017, we celebrated ten years by giving a "Musical Gift to Hong Kong" – a free public concert in the concert hall of the Hong Kong Cultural Centre for almost 1600 audience members. The concert featured ten international and twelve local musicians who have graced Premiere Performances stages in the past, performing some of the best repertoire in the chamber music canon. Our goal with this event was to bring chamber music – and Premiere Performances – to the people of Hong Kong, with a free programme that would appeal to all.









Premiere Performances' 10th anniversary marks significant impact on Hong Kong's cultural scene



A form of classical music played by two to ten players, each with a unique voice, in close musical conversation.




A CATALYST TO THE DEVELOPMENT OF A CHAMBER MUSIC CULTURE IN HONG KONG





Chamber Music In Schools

Our Chamber Music in Schools Programme brings specially trained chamber music ensembles into local schools for performances and workshops. In 2017/18, Premiere Performances organised four school tours: two from Musica Viva Australia (jazz ensemble The Sousaphonics and brass quintet Best of Brass), local wind quintet the Viva! Pipers, and a pilot tour with our new brass quintet Fiesta Brass.

At each school, ensembles perform a concert for up to 300 students, followed by a workshop for up to 40 students. We also provide professional development workshops and a teachers' resource kit with activities to reinforce the learning objectives of the in-school performances. The Australian ensembles also provided coaching for both our local ensembles.

Since its establishment in 2013, Chamber Music In Schools has brought 10 different ensembles to 313 schools, reaching over 80,000 students and 3,000 teachers.

Music Talks

During the Chamber Music Festival, we presented three music talks to increase concert-goers' appreciation and understanding of the music. These included:

Inside Chamber Music: a streamed lecture by Bruce Adolphe, in collaboration with the Chamber Music Society of Lincoln Centre, followed by a live performance of Debussy's Sonata for Flute, Viola and Harp by the Lilac Trio.

Music appreciation talk: a talk by Dr Austin Yip about how to appreciate 20th Century music.

Masterclasses & Workshops

Seven masterclasses and chamber music coaching sessions were conducted by Chamber Music Festival musicians. This year we had a very diverse roster of instruments, including harp, flute, viola, violin and piano. 32 local music students participated in the masterclasses, which were attended by 285 audience members.

Chamber Music Festival (13-24 January 2018)

The 9th Chamber Music Festival featured an exciting mix of established ensembles performing themed programming with unusual instrumentation. Highlights included an all-French programme featuring harp superstar Emmanuel Ceysson on opening night, an exploration of Beethoven's development featuring the Jerusalem Quartet and the Sitkovetsky Trio, a night of 20th Century repertoire including ensembles with flue or clarinet, and a programme of Russian repertoire centred around a piano four hands arrangement of the Rite of Spring performed by the Polonski/Weiss duo.






Financial Information

We closed the 2017-18 fiscal year just over breakeven with a net financial position of \$34,000, compared with a net position of \$284,000 in 2016-17. Overall, however, our budget was almost one third larger than in 2016-17. Our income in 2017-18 was 27% higher than in 2016-17, and our expenses increased by 32%. This increase is mirrored in our total audience reach, as we reached 32.7% more people through our programmes in this fiscal year (29,560 people in 2017-18 compared to 22,273 people in 2016-17).


To celebrate our 10th Anniversary, we held two special (non-recurring) events: our first ever fundraising gala (which raised over \$1.7 million from table sales, silent auction and sponsorship), and a chamber music concert at the Hong Kong Cultural Centre that was free to the public (which cost \$1.6 million). This was a great success, because the money earned at the Gala Dinner covered the total costs of the free public concert at the Cultural Centre.





Income

Our largest category of income remains Government Grants (35%). However this year Table Sales/ Auction income from the Gala was the second most significant source of income at 17%. Sponsorship, Donations (including from Governors) and Ticket Sales were all roughly the same at 17%, 16% and 13% respectively.



There is no question that our single biggest stakeholder is the Home Affairs Bureau through its support under the Art Development Matching Grants Pilot Scheme. We simply would not be able to put on the range of programs that we do without such a high level of government support (35%). However, because their support is a matching grant, we must continue to expand our fundraising efforts through Donations and Sponsorship in order to achieve the maximum level of government support (\$3 million).

In 2017-18, Sponsorship income increased by 20%. Although we still did not have a Title Sponsor for the Chamber Music Festival or the Chamber Music in Schools programme, we did find additional sponsors to support our Recitals as well as the 10th Anniversary Gala Concert & Fundraising Dinner.

Ticket revenue increased by 18.5% from 2016-17, despite the fact that we had fewer ticketed concerts.



We had particularly strong ticket sales for our Spring Recitals including the Danish String Quartet which sold out, as well as the Chamber Music Festival.

Donations from individuals decreased by 23%, to \$987,731 from \$1,283,350, down almost \$300,000. This shortfall had to be offset by an increase in donations from Governors, which increased by \$215,000 over 2016-17.

As mentioned above, our entire budget grew by one third in 2017-18 (\$2.1 million), reflecting our increased activities over the 2017-18 year.

Expenses

Concert Production (venue rental, production, printing) remained stable at 15% of our expenses (15.5% in 2016-17), and increased in dollar terms by 25.3% to \$1.285 million from \$1.025. Again, this increase reflected the 10th Anniversary Gala

Concert, as well as an increase in venue costs.

Marketing Expenses accounted for 16% of our Total Expenses, which is comparable to the 2016-17 level (16.6%). The amount we spent on marketing in 2017/18 increased by 27% over the previous fiscal year, primarily due to the additional branding campaign for the 10th Anniversary Gala Concert.



Concert Production (\$1,285,065)



Our single biggest expense remains Artist Expenses at 36%, which covers the costs of bringing performers to Hong Kong, including travel, accommodation transportation. Artist Expenses in 2017-18 increased by 20% from 2016-17 (which actually the lowest percentage increase out of all the expense categories).

Our Administration Costs were 27% of our total Expenses, which is consistent with the level in 2016-17 (27.9%). We spent \$2.367 million on Administration Expenses, up 28.1% from the previous year. The most significant increase came from adding an additional staff member (a junior person in Development) and hiring a PR/Marketing Consultant for the 10th Anniversary.
