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# Message from Our Founder & Executive Director

Looking back on the past year, it is fair to say that it has been the most successful year in Premiere Performances' history - both in terms of ticket sales and revenue. Almost all of our Recitals were sold out (including the balcony for four out of six Recitals) as well as all of our Family Concerts. We also held the first full-scale Beare's Premiere Music Festival since 2020. That means that we continued the momentum we gained during the pandemic, and that we have definitely broadened our audience reach. And we continued to grow our Chamber Music in Schools programme, touring five different ensembles across Hong Kong, including two overseas groups for the first time since 2019!

This year, we moved forward with pilot programs for our Jazz Series and into the Greater Bay Area. We held two jazz concerts at the Teahouse, Xiqu Centre with groups that we brought to Hong Kong for our Chamber Music in Schools programme. They were both incredibly well received and sold out within three weeks. We are excited to be launching Premiere Performances Jazz this Spring in collaboration with Jazz at Lincoln Center! Stay tuned for more details.

Our pilot into the Greater Bay Area was less successful. It seems that it is very tough to attract audiences to recitals with less "popular" programming. Even though we started small, partnering with a beautiful concert hall in Shenzhen that only seats 300 people, it was still difficult to sell enough tickets to cover our costs. For that reason, we are going to pause our activities in the GBA for the time being.

We are so grateful to the Culture, Sports & Tourism Bureau for their continued support under the Art Development Matching Grants Scheme, whereby every dollar we are able to raise in donations and net sponsorship is matched 150% (increased to 180% until March 31, 2025). As this is a Matching Grant, we would receive nothing from the government were it not for the generous and unwavering support of our donor base. Thank you to every individual who donated this past year. Every amount, large and small, is greatly appreciated.

## Chamber Music in Schools

IN 2023/24, WE REACHED

Making in the inspiration of a live music performance accessible to all is central to PPHK's mission. As one of the few organizations in the city specialising in chamber music, we are proud to be building a vibrant local arts scene and nurturing young audiences with our wide range of Outreach & Education Programmes.

Since the establishment of our Chamber Music in Schools (CMIS) programme in 2013, we have brought 15 different overseas and local ensembles to Hong Kong schools, organising over 510

school performances, and reaching almost 135,000 kindergarten, primary, secondary and special educational needs students and 6000 teachers.

In 2023-24, we had five active groups: three local ensembles (Fiesta Brass, Rhythmaker and Viva! Pipers) and two overseas ensembles: Adam Hall & The Velvet Players (from Perth, Australia) and Hot Club of San Francisco (from San Francisco, California, USA).

lhese groups gave a total of 63 performances at 54 schools during 2023-24 including 2 kindergartens, 24 primary schools, 9 secondary schools, 7 international schools and 12 special needs schools. With these school visits, our groups performed for over 11,500 students and over 500 teachers.

### Week with Tony Yike Yang

We brought Canadian Chinese pianist Tony Yike Yang to Hong Kong for one week of performances and outreach activities (13-19 Oct 2023) under the auspices of the Beare's Premiere Music Festival. Tony was the youngest-ever laureate at the 2015 Chopin International Piano Competition at the age of 16 (winning 5th prize) and has been hailed by the Canadian Broadcasting Corporation (CBC) as one of Canada's finest young musicians.

# Benjamin Grosvenor, piano "Chopin & Liszt"

29 September 2023 (Friday)

Benjamin Grosvenor made his triumphant return to Hong Kong eight years after his début in 2015, with a programme featuring sonatas by Chopin and Liszt. Even though the concert was on the eve of Mid-Autumn Festival, the concert still sold out completely, with 1419 tickets out (including balcony) (99% attendance rate).



30 October 2023 (Monday)

### Alice Sara Ott, piano "Echoes of Life"

20 November 2023 (Monday)



The programme featured Chopin's 24 Preludes, interspersed with seven works by contemporary composers including György Ligeti, Tōru Takemitsu and Ott herself, and was accompanied by a video installation by architect Hakan Damirel, presenting a truly immersive and creative concert journey. The concert was sponsored by the Sun Hung Kai Foundation. The concert was almost sold-out (including balcony) with 1411 tickets out. (98.5% attendance rate)

# Arnaud Sussman, violin with Michael Stephen Brown, piano "French Impressions"

13 May 2024

Co-presented by the French May Arts Festival, French violin virtuoso Arnaud Sussmann and his recital partner Michael Stephen Brown delighted Hong Kong audiences with a beautiful program of Saint-Saëns, Debussy, Boulanger and Stravinsky. There were 877 tickets out (84% attendance rate). Arnaud & Michael also performed a recital at the Mountain View Theatre at Sea World Arts & Culture Centre in Shenzhen for approx. 150 audience members.

There were 1261 tickets out (including balcony) (91% attendance rate).

# Beare's Premiere Music Festival 2024



The Beare's Premiere Music Festival 2024 ("BPM Festival") took place from 14-19 January 2024. The 2024 edition marked the triumphant return of the BPM Festival in its full scale for the first time in four years, featuring a world-class roster of musicians. The BPM Festival featured a total of 26 musicians, performing in six concerts at Hong Kong City Hall, five private events and 17 engaging outreach activities for music students and the general public.

The 2024 Beare's Premiere Music Festival featured a wide range of programmes including a Spotlight on the Miró Quartet which featured the Asian Premiere of Pulitzer-prize winner Caroline Shaw's *Microfictions*, an all-Mozart evening, a concert featuring gems of the Romantic era, and an evening with acclaimed Irish tenor Robin Tritschler. There were also two performances of our Family Concert entitled Musical Fairytales: Peter and the Wolf, featuring charming chamber music works with narration to spark children's imaginations.

### In 2024 Beare's Premiere Music Festival, there were:

22 events over 16 days (4 - 19 Jan) of the main BPM Festival, with 6 more events under the auspices of the BPM Festival during 13 - 19 Oct 2023, making a total of **28 events**. These events involved:

- 6 ticketed concerts at Hong Kong City Hall, including 2 engaging Family Concerts
- 17 free Beyond the Performances events including:
  - 5 open rehearsals
  - 8 masterclasses and coaching sessions
- 3 free hybrid education concerts, combining a panel discussion, masterclass and sharing / Q&A
  - 2 educational talks
  - 5 private events
  - 7 Sponsors & Collaborators

Led by Ning Feng, the festival musicians showcased their virtuosity in Schumann's Piano Quintet, ending this breathtaking musical journey on a high note.

# Family Series

In 2023-24, we had eight ticketed Family Concerts (including two during the Beare's Premiere Music Festival).

### Musical Fairy Tales, "Cindercella"

## Premiere Performances Jazz

Two of the groups that we brought from overseas for our Chamber Music in Schools programme were jazz ensembles (Adam Hall & the Velvet Players and Hot Club of San Francisco), so we ran a pilot programme called Premiere Performances Jazz in collaboration with the West Kowloon Cultural District. Held at the Teahouse, Xiqu Centre with a capacity of 165, each group gave two shows: one at 7pm and one at 9pm. All of the shows were almost sold out. People could also order drinks in advance or on site.



Surveys collected after each Recital, Beare's Premiere Music Festival and Family Concert tell us about our audiences. The following represents an average of all of the series.




### Age

It is clear that our concerts appeal to all ages, but notably half of our audience is under the age of 50.


#### **Education**

Our audience is highly educated, with over 95% having a university education.




### **Mother Tongue**

# **Donor Programmes**

Donations at every level are extremely important to us, so we have created various donor programmes to support our work. Developing a strong and stable donor base is essential because we are the recipient of a government matching grant called the Art Development Matching Grants Scheme whereby every dollar we raise from donors is matched 150% (180% until March 31, 2024) by the Culture, Sports and Tourism Bureau. Without private donations, we would simply not be able to continue delivering the range and quality of our programmes.

#### **Audience of Tomorrow**

The Audience of Tomorrow Project is a donor initiative that underwrites tickets to Premiere Performances' concerts, allowing underprivileged children and elderly to attend our concerts. In 2023/24, we donated 359 tickets to



### **Young Music Lovers Circle**



# **Financial Information**

The 2023-24 fiscal year was the first full year with no COVID restrictions in place, and represents the most successful year-to-date in the history of Premiere Performances, with respect to income, ticket sales and concert attendance.




#### **Income**



Our income increased by 45% in 2023-24 compared to the previous fiscal year (\$11,069,741 compared to \$7,637,528 in FY2023-24). Our biggest income category remained Government Grants at 41% of our annual income, up 91% year on year (\$4,517,910; up from \$2,368,058 in FY2022-23). This increase in Government Grants is a result of the timing of receipt of certain grants.

We are very fortunate to have the support of the Culture, Sports and Tourism Bureau under the Art Development Matching Grants Scheme. For the fifth year in a row, the Culture, Sports and Tourism Bureau retroactively changed the matching ratio from 1.5:1 to 1.8:1, and increased the maximum amount of the grant from \$4.0 million to \$4.5 million as a special subsidy due to the hardships of the pandemic.

#### Income 2023/24 Compared to 2022/23



For the third year in a row, Ticket Sales (\$3,507,614) was the second largest category of income, accounting for a record-breaking 31.7% of our income (up 78% from \$1,966,412 in FY2022-23, which previously was record-breaking). Almost all of our concerts in FY2023-24 were sold out, with record-breaking ticket sales. In FY2023-24, we presented 23 concerts (up from 15 concerts in FY2022-23): 6 Recitals, 7 Family Concerts, 6 concerts in the Beare's Premiere Music Festival and 4 Jazz Concerts. While the increase in ticket sales can be attributed to an increased number of concerts, the average attendance rate was also considerably higher than in previous years.


Private donations remain a very important component of our income, comprising 14% of our total income, increasing 8% over FY2022-23. However, as we did not organize a fundraising gala event in FY 2023-24, our overall total donations decreased by 43% (\$1,594,332 in FY 2023-24 compared to \$2,815,313 in FY 2022-23). Where possible, we prefer to limit our fundraising gala events to specific milestones (like an anniversary), and so the next gala is not likely to take place until 2027.

With the return of the Beare's Premiere Music Festival which was held for the first time since 2020, concert sponsorship bounced back, accounting for 10% of our annual income (up from 5% in FY2022-23). We raised \$1,125,000 in concert sponsorship in FY 2023-24, which is considerably more than the \$358,993 we raised in FY 2022-23, representing an increase of 213%. Corporate sponsors included J&A Beare, the Title Sponsor of the Beare's Premiere Music Festival, BNP Paribas, who continue to support the Viva! Pipers for their Chamber Music in Schools tour, Sun Hung Kai Foundation who sponsored the recital by Alice Sara Ott, and Interlude, which supported the Romantic Interlude concert during the Beare's Premiere Music Festival. The recital by Miloš was also sponsored by a private individual.

#### **Expenses**


With all of this increased activity, our Total Expenses for FY 2022-23 increased by 53% over the previous year. We spent \$8,641,762 in FY 2023-24, up from \$5,574,804 in FY2022-23.

### 2023/24 Expenses



For the first time in four years, our biggest category of expenses was Artist Expenses, which comprised 44.1% of our Total Expenses (up from 28% in FY2022-23). Artist Expenses increased by 143% year-on-year (\$3,812,386, up from \$1,565,917 in the previous fiscal year). This substantial increase can be attributed not only to increased concert activity and additional artists (visa fees increased by 481% year-on-year, which means we brought almost five times as many artists to Hong Kong!) but also because (i) Joyce DiDonato's EDEN involved a large ensemble and (ii) for the first time since 2019, we brought over international ensembles (Adam Hall & the Velvet Players and Hot Club of San Francisco) for week-long school tours and concert activities.

2023/24 Expenses Compared to 2022/23




The second largest category of expenses was Administration, which comprised 30.6% of Total Expenses (down from 42% in the previous year). Administration costs increased 12% year-on-year (\$2,645,860, compared to \$2,362,761 in FY2022-23). Payroll costs (plus MPF) accounted for 66% of Administration costs (67% in FY2022-23), and office rent was 16% of Administration costs (18% in FY2022-23). Payroll costs increased by 10% year-on-year.

Concert Production (venue rental, production, printing) accounted for 17.5% of our Total Expenses (13% in 2022-23), almost doubling year on year (\$1,512,790 in FY2023-24, up from \$751,989 in FY2022-23) which is an increase of 91%. With things returning to normal, the LCSD ended its subsidy of the venue rental fees, so our venue rental costs increased 235% year-on-year.

Marketing Expenses continued to decrease, down 4% over the previous fiscal year, constituting only 7.8% of our Total Expenses (down from 12% in FY2022-23). We spent \$670,726 for Marketing (down from \$684,961 in FY2022-23). With the increased migration to digital marketing, we no longer need to procure expensive MTR campaigns or print ads, so our Marketing Expenses have decreased significantly.

Since we previously benchmarked our success as having more Ticket Sales than Marketing Expenses, a look at these two variables over the last ten years shows how far we have come in our marketing efforts. In five of the last ten years, Marketing Expenses were higher than Ticket Sales or about equal. That has clearly not been the case for the last three years, and this year especially, where Ticket Sales exceeded Marketing Expenses by a ratio of 5 to 1.
