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# Message from Our Founder & Executive Director

I am very happy that this past fiscal year, we were able to continue the positive momentum coming out of two record-breaking years in a row. We were able to maintain high attendance rates and ticket sales results, proving that we have a consistent and growing audience for our programmes. We continued to add more concerts to our calendar, with an expanded Recital Series and Family Concert Series. We also successfully launched our Jazz Series, with eight sold-out concerts by two groups from New York, through our collaboration with Jazz at Lincoln Center.

As I write this message, we are busy preparing for the final edition of the Beare's Premiere Music Festival, our annual chamber music festival. Before we launched our festival in 2009, chamber music was almost unheard of in Hong Kong. Today, the scene flourishes with many new local ensembles and regular visits from world-renowned groups. We are proud to have accomplished our mission to introduce Hong Kong audiences to this exquisite art form.

Instead, we are going to focus on discovering emerging talents worldwide and introducing them to Hong Kong audiences for the first time. Through our campaign "You Heard Them Here First - at Premiere Performances!", we are returning to our original focus. In fact, that is where the name "Premiere Performances" comes from—the double meaning of "premiere" as both debut and world class.

We are so grateful to the Culture, Sports & Tourism Bureau for their continued support under the Art Development Matching Grants Scheme, whereby every dollar we are able to raise in donations and net sponsorship is matched 180%. As this is a Matching Grant, we would receive nothing from the government were it not for the generous and unwavering support of our donor base. Thank you to every individual who donated this past year. Every amount, large and small, is greatly appreciated.

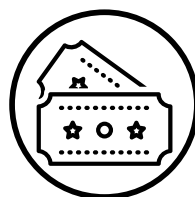
## Overview

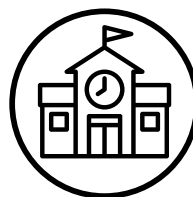

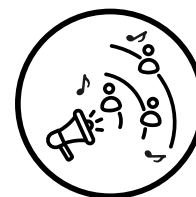

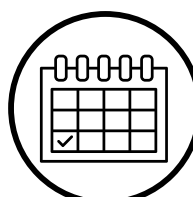

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# Chamber Music in Schools

Making classical music accessible to all is central to Premiere Performances' mission. As one of the few organizations in the city that specializes in chamber music, we are proud to be building a vibrant local arts scene and nurturing young audiences with our wide range of Outreach & Education Programmes.

Since the establishment of our Chamber Music in Schools (CMIS) programme in 2013, we have brought 15 different overseas and local ensembles to Hong Kong schools, organising over **600** school performances, and reaching almost **140,000** kindergarten, primary, secondary and special educational needs students and **7000** teachers.

In 2024/25, we had three active groups, which were our local ensembles (Viva! Pipers, Fiesta Brass, and Rhythmaker).

In total, these groups gave a total of 40 school performances at 38 schools during 2024/25 including 1 kindergarten, 22 primary schools, 7 secondary schools, and 8 special needs schools. With these school visits, our groups performed for 9,225 students and 625 teachers.

# Recital Series

We had our biggest Recital Series to date in 2024/25 with 9 successful concerts featuring a wide range of instruments and repertoires, including piano, violin, cello, guitar, harp, tenor, and string quartet/quintet. All Recitals took place in Hong Kong City Hall Concert Hall.

## Sean Shibe Guitar Recital

**“Unplugged”** 29 September 2024 (Sunday)

Scottish guitarist Sean Shibe made his triumphant Hong Kong debut, with a programme featuring acoustic guitar repertoire including works by Bach, Barrios, Villa-Lobos and the HK premiere of a new work by British composer Thomas Adès called “Forgotten Dances”. There were 892 tickets out and an 86% attendance rate. This concert was sponsored by Elia Mourtzanou.

## Karim Sulayman & Sean Shibe: “Broken Branches”

4 October 2024 (Friday)

In his Hong Kong debut, American tenor Karim Sulayman and Scottish guitarist Sean Shibe presented “Broken Branches”, a conceptual recital that explored the cultural and musical ties between the East and the West. The programme ranged from Monteverdi and Purcell to Britten and Middle East folk songs, exploring music that tied in with the artists’ mixed identity, as they each grew up in the West (United States and Scotland) but with ethnic roots in the East (Lebanon and Japan). There were 884 tickets out and an 85% attendance rate.

## Clara-Jumi Kang Violin Recital, with Yekwon Sunwoo, piano

5 November 2024 (Tuesday)



Superstar Korean violinist Clara-Jumi Kang started her stunning recital programme with the immensely technical and emotional Bach Chaconne for solo violin. She was then joined by Van Cliburn gold medal-winner Yekwon Sunwoo in the remarkable Weinberg Sonata No. 4, followed by the expressive and romantic Strauss Violin Sonata. The Korean Cultural Centre in Hong Kong was a concert collaborator. There were 968 tickets out and a 93% attendance rate.

## Narek Hakhnazaryan Cello Recital, with Rachel Cheung, piano

18 November 2024 (Monday)

Following the cancellation of Sol Gabetta, Tchaikovsky Competition Gold Medal Winner Narek Hakhnazaryan stepped into her place and kept Gabetta's original programme which included sonatas by Schumann and Shostakovich. He was joined by local star pianist Rachel Cheung. This was Narek's fourth appearance with Premiere Performances. There were 1267 tickets out, with an 89% attendance rate. The Festival featured a total of 38 musicians, performing in 7 concerts, 3 private events and 12 engaging outreach activities for music students and the general public. The second half featured Fauré's evocative Piano Quartet, and the grand finale of our Festival, the fireworks of Bizet's Carmen Fantasy. There were 942 tickets out and a 91% attendance rate.

Pipers, Romer String Quartet, and Hannah Tam, Richard Bamping, Anna Kwan, Eric Yip and Evelyn Chang for three entertaining stories, including “The Frog Prince”, “Ferdinand the Bull”, and Steven Isserlis & Anne Dudley’s brilliant “Goldipegs & the Three Cellos”. There were 447 tickets out for both the English and Cantonese shows, and a 97% attendance rate.

## Family Concerts

We had a very successful season of Family Concerts, featuring our local ensembles. These are specially designed one hour concerts for kids aged 5-11 and their families, and typically take place on Sunday afternoons. In 2024/2025, we had eight ticketed Family Concerts (including two during the Beare’s Premiere Music Festival).

There were 455 tickets out and 99% attendance rate for the 2:30 Cantonese show, and 453 tickets out and 98% attendance rate for the 4:30 English show.

## Romer String Quartet

This Cantonese-only interactive show featured the popular Romer String Quartet introducing kids to a string quartet. The musicians explained their instruments, techniques and demonstrated the cool things a string quartet can do with music by Ravel, Puccini, Debussy, Piazzolla and George Crumb. After the show in March at the Sheung Wan Civic Centre Concert Hall sold out (452 tickets out, 98% attendance rate), we added two additional shows in Sha Tin Town Hall, Cultural Activities Hall (with an aggregate of 565 tickets out, 95% attendance rate).

## Rhythmaker Percussion Quintet

The 2:30pm free concert was specifically designated for beneficiaries of NGO partners, with 434 tickets out. The sold-out 4:30pm show had 479 tickets out, with a 100% attendance rate.

## Young Music Lovers Circle

After a hiatus of five years, we relaunched our patron programme for young professionals. For a minimum donation of HK\$4,000, young patrons (up to age 39) gain access to events involving world-class classical musicians, many of whom are also in their 20s and 30s. We relaunched the Circle with a special performance by American Chinese soprano/pianist Chelsea Guo at the Liang Yi Museum. Other events included a private salon by Yekwon Sunwoo.

## Audience of Tomorrow

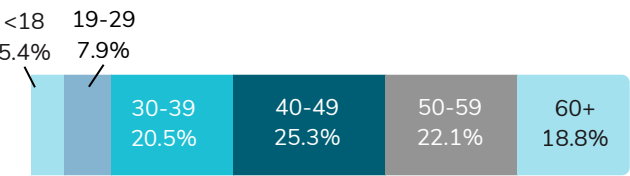

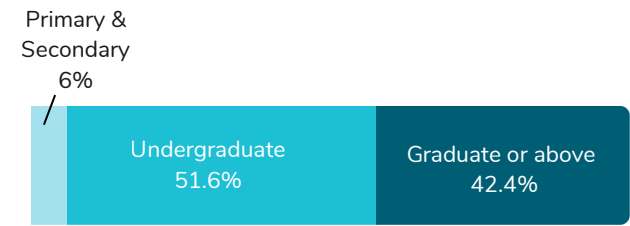
# Our Audience

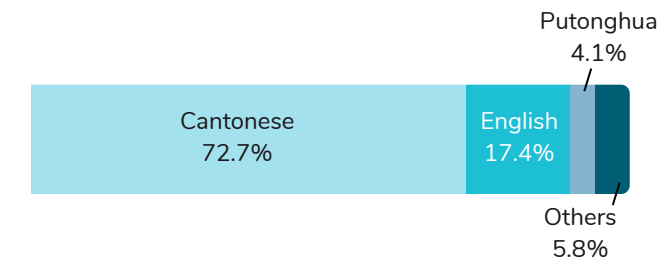
## Age

Our audience is highly educated, with over 90% having a university education.



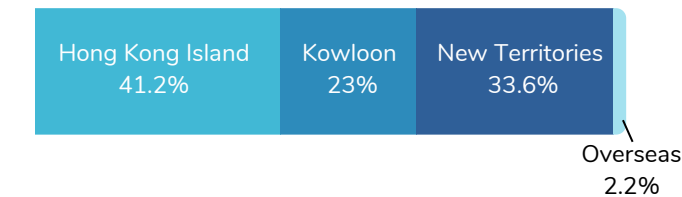
## Mother Tongue

Our concerts attract people from all economic backgrounds.

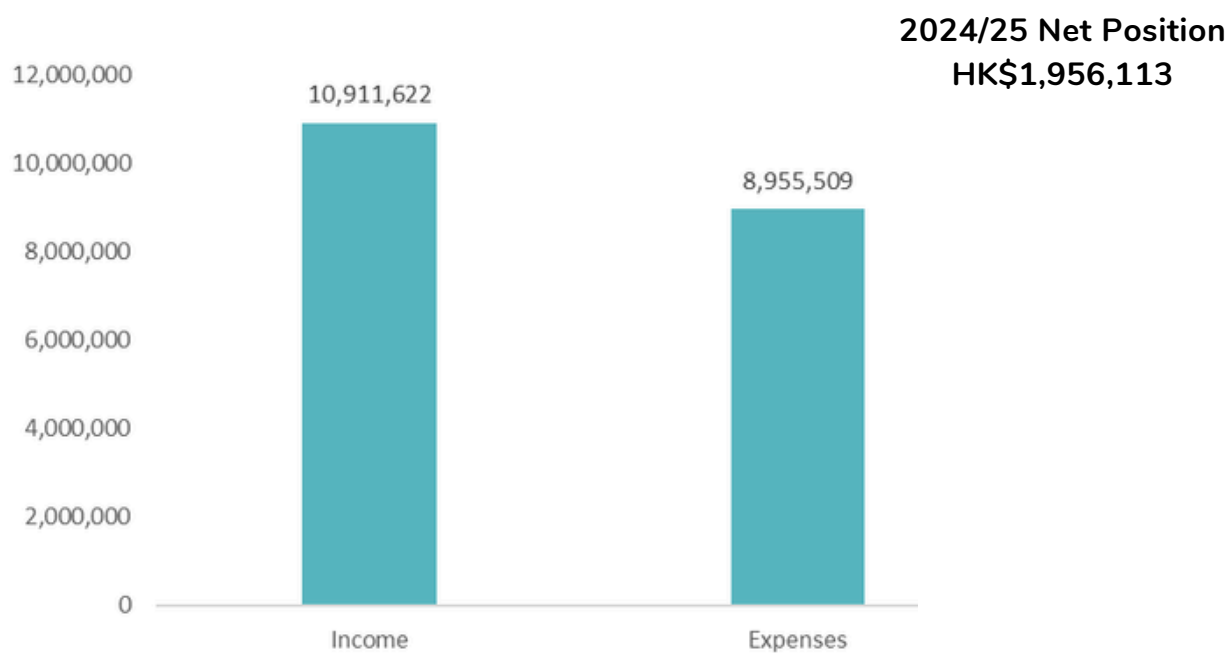


## District of Residence

# Financial Information

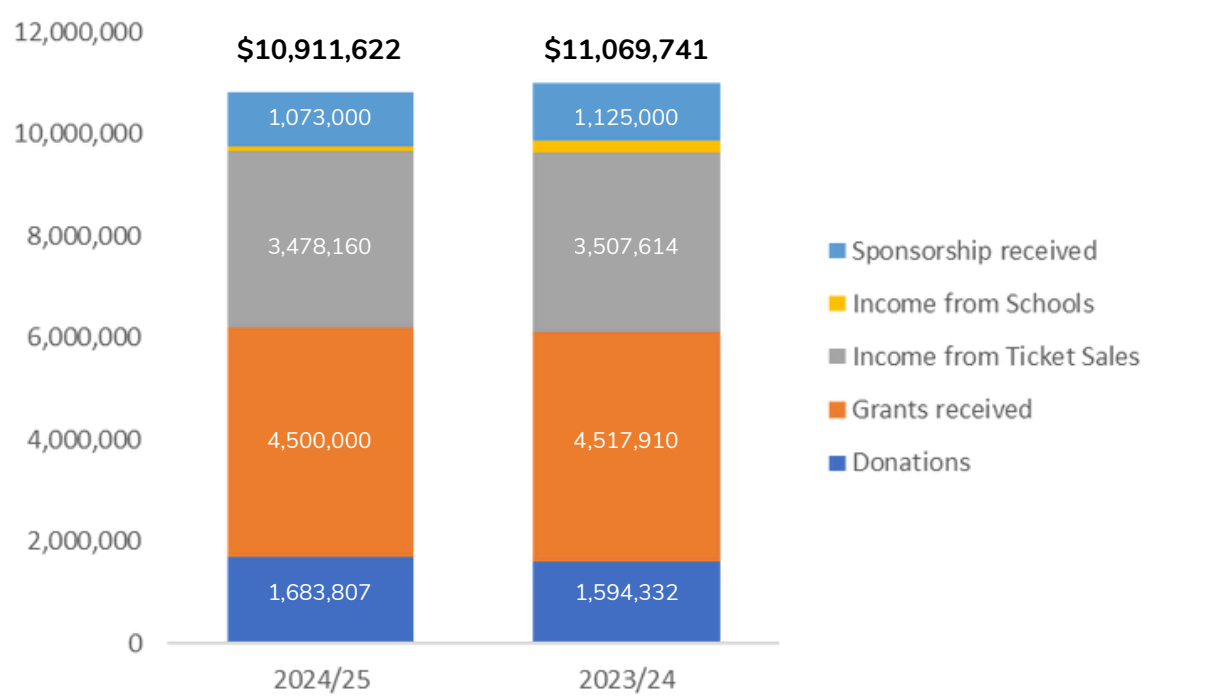
Following the most successful year in Premiere Performances’ history, the 2024/25 fiscal year (FY) remained strong with respect to income and net financial position. We closed the fiscal year with a healthy surplus.



## Income

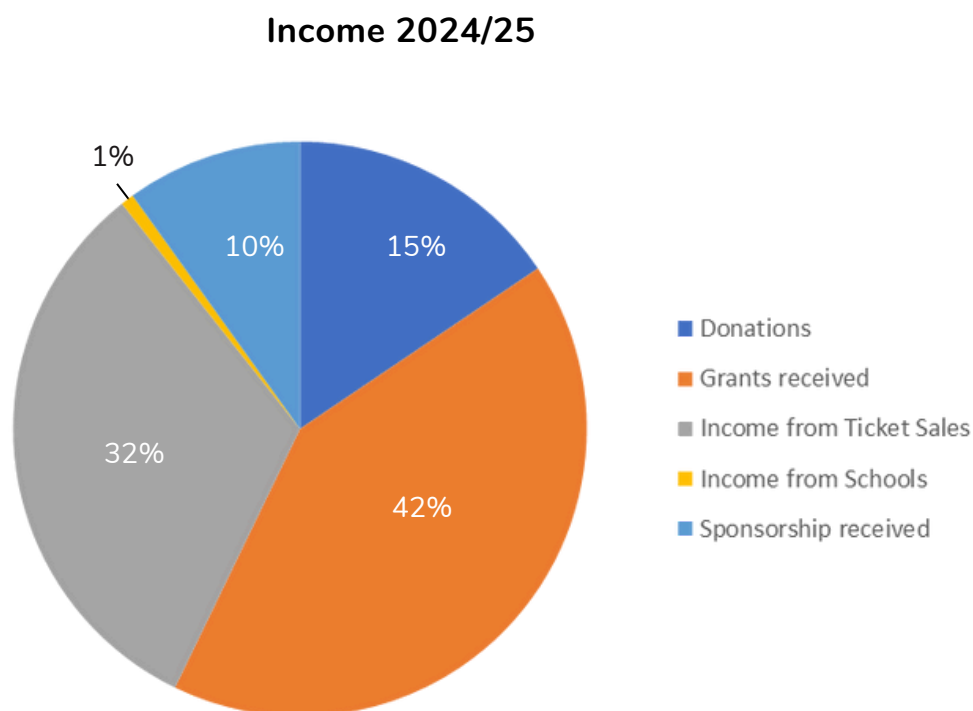
Our income was basically flat year-on-year, with a marginal 1% decrease (\$10,911,622 compared to \$11,069,741 in FY2023/24, a decrease of only \$158,119). Our biggest income category remained Government Grants at 42% of our annual income, flat year on year (\$4,500,000 compared to \$4,517,910 in FY2023/24).

We are very fortunate to have the continued support of the Culture, Sports and Tourism Bureau under the Art Development Matching Grants Scheme. For the sixth year in a row, the Culture, Sports and Tourism Bureau retroactively changed the matching ratio from 1.5:1 to 1.8:1, and increased the maximum amount of the grant from \$4.0 million to \$4.5 million.



Ticket Sales remains our second largest category of income at \$3,478,160, and stayed remarkably flat year-on-year, accounting for 32% of our income (down only \$29,455 from \$3,507,614 in FY2023/24 which was a record-breaking year). In FY2024/25, we presented 30 concerts (up from 23 concerts in FY2023/24) which is a 30% increase: 9 Recitals (6 in FY2023/24), 8 Family Concerts (two of which were in the Beare’s Premiere Music Festival) (7 in FY2023/24), 7 concerts in the Beare’s Premiere Music Festival (6 in FY2023/24) and 8 Jazz Concerts (4 in FY2023/24). Given that ticket sales remained flat despite an increased number of concerts, one can see that the average attendance rate actually decreased from FY2023/24.

Private donations remain a very important component of our income, comprising 15% of our total income, increasing marginally by 1% over FY2023/24. (\$1,683,807 in FY2024/25, compared to \$1,594,332 in FY2023/24, a difference of only \$89,474). We are very fortunate to have built a stable base of annual donors.

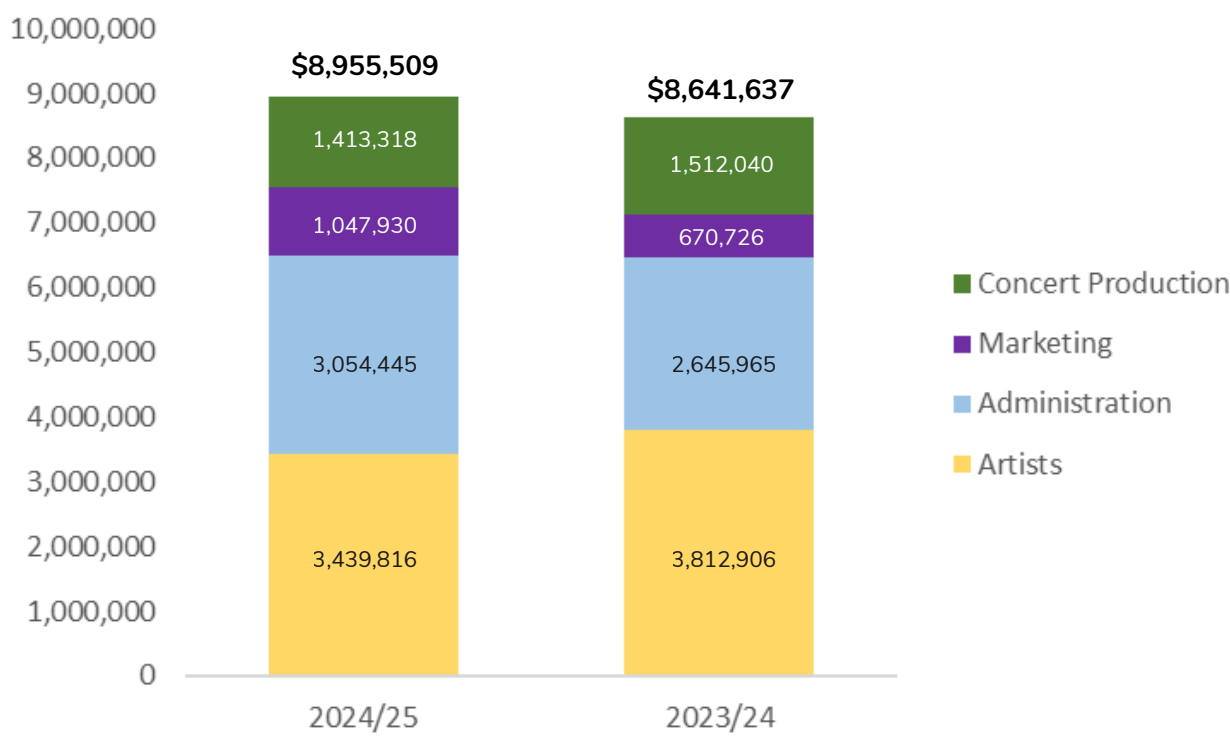
We held another successful edition of the Beare’s Premiere Music Festival which kept concert sponsorship flat year-on-year, accounting for 10% of our annual income. We raised \$1,073,000 in concert sponsorship, which is a decrease of \$52,000 (or 5%) from FY2023/24 of \$1,125,000. Corporate sponsors included J & A Beare, the Title Sponsor of the Beare’s Premiere Music Festival; SystematicEdge, a private asset management firm which supported the Spring 2025 Recital Series; BNP Paribas, which continued to support the Viva! Pipers for their Chamber Music in Schools tour; and Interlude, which sponsored one concert during the Beare’s Premiere Music Festival. The recitals by Sean Shibe and Narek Hakhnazaryan were also sponsored by private individuals.

Expenses

With all of this increased activity, our Total Expenses for FY2024/25 only increased 4% over the previous year. We spent \$8,955,509 in FY2024/25, up from \$8,641,637 in FY2023/24.

Our biggest category of expenses remained Artist Expenses (including Performance Fees, Airfare, Hotel, Visa Fees, Transportation, Hospitality and Taxes) for the second year in a row, which comprised 38% of our Total Expenses (down from 44% in FY2023/24). Artist Expenses decreased 10% year-on-year (\$3,439,816, down from \$3,812,906 in the previous fiscal year)

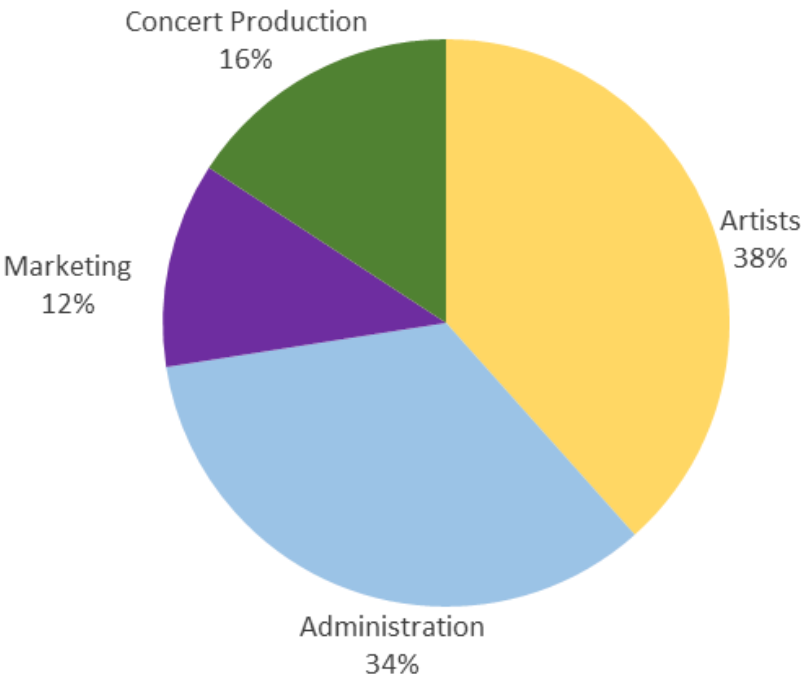
2024/25 Expenses Compared to 2023/24





The second largest category of Expenses was Administration, which comprised 34% of Total Expenses (up from 31% in the previous year). Administration costs increased 15% year-on-year (\$3,054,445 compared to \$2,645,965 in FY2023/24). Manpower (which includes Payroll, Consultancy and MPF) accounted for 73% of Administration costs (70% in FY2023/24), and office rent was 14% of Administration costs (16% in FY2023/24). Manpower costs increased by 21% year-on-year; this is primarily because we hired two additional staff members to assist with the increased workload from presenting more events, as well as using external consultants for some tasks that could be outsourced.

2024/25 Expenses



Concert Production (venue rental, production, printing) accounted for 16% of our Total Expenses (18% in FY2023/24), with a decrease of 7% year-on-year (\$1,413,318, compared to \$1,512,040 in FY2023/24, a difference of only \$98,722).

Marketing Expenses increased by 56% over the previous fiscal year, constituting 12% of our Total Expenses (up from 8% in FY2023/24). We spent \$1,047,930 for Marketing (up from \$670,726 in FY2023/24). This is because we had more concerts to advertise, and the cost of digital marketing is also increasing, as Meta and Google ads are becoming more popular thereby bidding up the price of digital ad campaigns.
